Uniform Reminder & PE Days 2025-2026

During the course of this academic year, we are phasing out some of our school uniform in an effort to make it more affordable for our parent body.

Our school uniform provider now sells school badges for £1.20 so that you are able to purchase plain white polo shirts/ plain red jumpers/cardigans and iron on the badge. (Our current provider will continue to sell their stock of red and grey uniform items and staff has been informed that it is a gradual phase out)

We have reduced the number of days that children require their school uniform by allowing them to wear their PE kit on two days of the week. (You will be notified if there is a special day such as school photographs so that you can ensure that children are dressed appropriately.)

Last week, a wonderful group of children visited the Science Museum with Miss Vernon, Miss Vernon's son Ethan, and Miss Cooney. The children had the opportunity to learn about space, and visit the Space Gallery where they discovered inspiring stories of human achievement in space travel. They also got to see many significant space objects including a three-billion-year-old piece of the moon, brought back to Earth by the Apollo 15! After their visit to space, they had the chance to visit the other science galleries to investigate the science around us with hands on exhibits to support their learning. The children were a credit to our school and shared their future aspirations after learning more about their dream.

Umair is still a future physicist and Sulaiman a future scientist. John will be an astronaut and learn more about chemistry. Nabeeha will discover more of the galaxy as an astronomer along with Arham, and Nikita will be collecting moon rocks to learn more about space.

We have no doubt they will achieve these dreams!

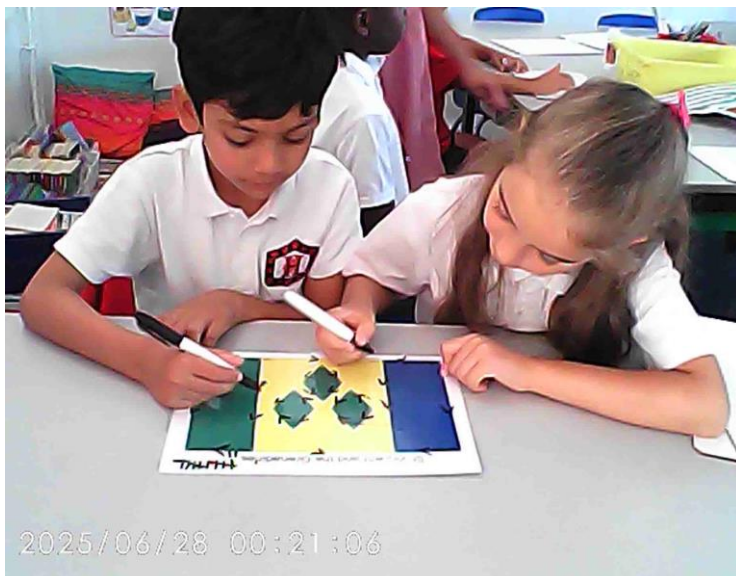
Dance for Rights Workshop

On Tuesday 7th July, Year 3 participated in a 'Dance for Rights' workshop. Together, with schools across the country they created a fantastic celebration of creativity, movement and children's rights.

A huge thank you to Miss Ryan for giving Year 3 the opportunity to participate in such a fun event!



In the spirit of the World Cup, 3MK have been linking their Maths and Geography learning. Working in pairs, the children explored the world map to identify geometric patterns hidden inside international flags. Students hunted for **parallel lines** in the horizontal and vertical stripes of Germany and Mauritius. **Perpendicular lines** forming right angles in the flags of England and Switzerland. **Both line types** combined in complex flags like South Africa and the USA.



Following on from last week's traffic survey on Reede Road, 3MK created informative posters to encourage people to walk, cycle or scoot instead of driving whenever possible. Using the computing skills they developed last term, the children designed eye catching digital posters explaining the impact that traffic and pollution have on our local area. They also shared simple ways that we can all do our part to keep our air cleaner, protect the environment and make our community healthier and safer.

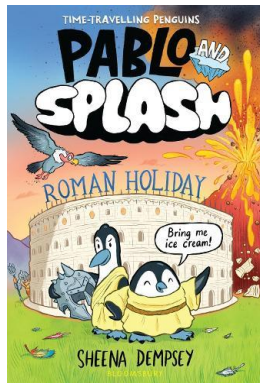


Early Readers – Gozzle

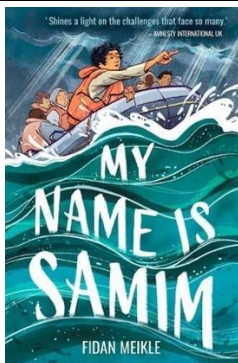
A funny and joyful picture book about home, family and belonging!

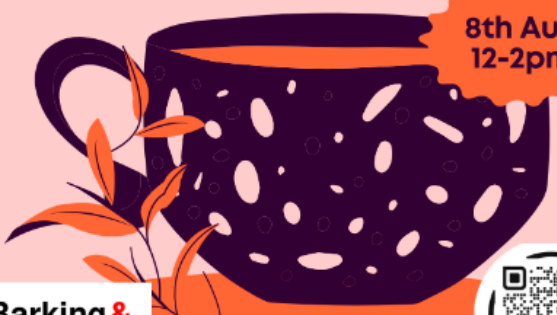

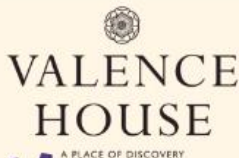
